President Lincoln writes an endorsement on a letter from David Lindsay to Adjutant General Lorenzo Thomas. Lindsay is attempting to correct an assignment error. He explains, "I inlisted in the 17th Regt. Pa. Cavalry and...I was sent to the 90th Pa Infantry." Lindsay seeks a transfer to the 17th in order to "be along with...the only Brother I have." Lincoln writes, "I have seen this man, who seems to be an intelligent & manly man, and whose story I believe to be true. If it does not involve much inconvenience, let the transfer...be made."
