Republican presidential nominee Lincoln writes to William Dickson, who is married to Mary Lincoln's cousin. Lincoln asks Dickson, of Cincinnati, Ohio, to investigate a bill he received from the proprietors of Cincinnati's Burnet House, where Lincoln stayed in September 1859, as a guest of Ohio Republicans. Lincoln explains, "I...was...told the bill 'was settled'...I can and will pay it if it is right; but I do not wish to be 'diddled!'...Please do what you do quietly, having no fuss about it."
