NOVEMBER 3, 1845

In the Menard County Circuit Court case of *People v. Pond*, a jury finds Lincoln's client, Marvin Pond, not guilty of harboring a fugitive slave. The Court orders that Pond "be discharged, and that he go hence without delay." State's Attorney David Campbell charged that on June 10, 1845, Pond "did unlawfully harbor a negro slave called John Hauley...owing service and labor to one William Hauley in the State of Kentucky."
