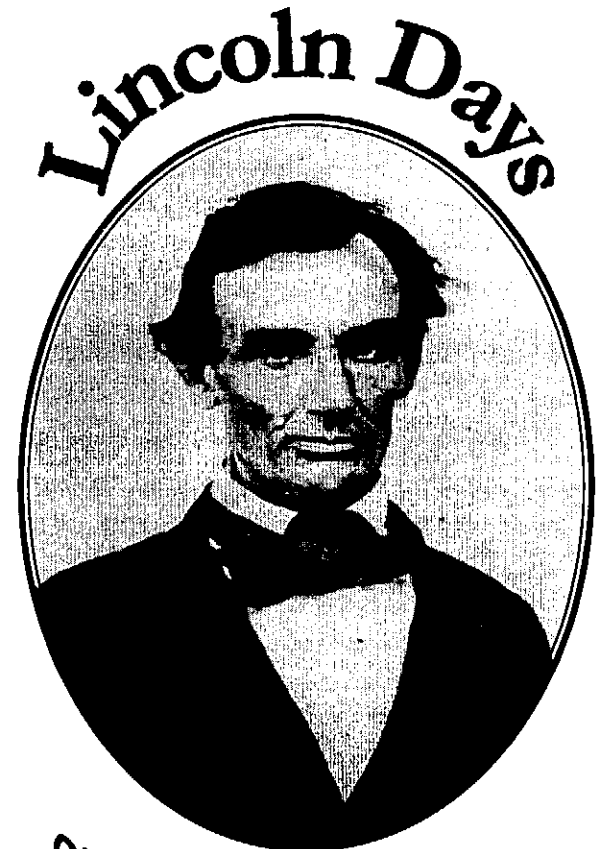
President and Mrs. Lincoln will be visiting on both days. President Lincoln loves to tell stories and is always available for a photograph.
